Home Fires

- 80%-90% of Americans feel safer from fires at home than in a public building, or feel equally safe in both locations. they couldn't be more wrong.
- Nearly four times as many fires occur in homes than in non-residences.
- 85% of all US fire deaths happen in homes.
- The Rochester Fire Department responds to 2 fire calls every day.

Prevention 1st Home Fire Drill Campaign

- Prevention 1st created the Home Fire Drill initiative to update and enhance the biannual message "Change Your Clock, Change Your Batteries."
- Our new message is: Change Your Clock; Test Your Alarms; Practice Your Home Fire Drill; Alarm Goes Off, You Get Out"
- This message reminds people to:
 - Check all alarms to make sure they're still working. Many smoke alarms now have long-life batteries or are hard-wired, so people tend to ignore the original "change your batteries" message.
 - Respond immediately to CO detectors as well as smoke alarms
 - Plan and practice what you will do when the alarms goes off.
